What approach should we use to guide us though a crisis?




1. Be attuned to ones self – reflecting and knowing yourself – move beyond just thinking (thinking about thinking) – soul searching – lead wholesomely

2. Be attuned to your history - Know your history – where have you come from (Chickens – your farm) – engage your history – if there were mistakes don't repeat them

Task: Jot down - How do you think you will be able to go about being able to understand the needs and desires of the students in your residence (House)

4. Attuned to your future – understand what is happening around your residence and its place at Rhodes and Rhodes (as an institution of learning in SA and its place in the world (globality and globalization)
