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PROTECTION OF WHISTLEBLOWERS

1. Purpose

The purpose of these guidelines is to clearly define how whistleblowers will be protected.

2. Definition of whistleblowing

Whistleblowing is the activity of a person, often an employee, revealing information about activity that is deemed illegal, immoral, illicit, unsafe, or fraudulent.

3. Reporting of suspected unethical conduct

Whistleblowers can use a variety of internal or external channels to communicate information or allegations. Procedures for the reporting of suspected or alleged unethical conduct are clearly defined in SOP 3.2 PROCEDURES FOR REPORTING ALLEGATIONS OF UNETHICAL RESEARCH PRACTICE.

4. Protection of Whistleblowers

- 5.1. A variety of measures are provided to ensure that the anonymity of whistleblowers is not compromised. Whistleblowers will be protected as follows:
 - 1) Enabling anonymous reports.
 - 2) Multiple channels of whistleblowing including submission of reports online, over the phone to an agent, or in person.
 - 3) Whistleblowers can decide whether they require follow-up communication.
