## **Pointers to remember for Examinations**

## **Sit-down Examinations**

- PLEASE ARRIVE EARLY Morning (AM) sessions start writing at 08h30 and afternoon (PM) sessions start writing at 14h00. Candidates are reminded that they must be seated no later than fifteen (15) minutes before the start of each session, five minutes ahead of the doors being locked.
- Seating in the venues will be pre-arranged according to courses:
  - 1. Check the seating plan displayed at the venue
  - 2. Take up the seat that has been allocated to you
  - 3. If you are not sure where to go, please ask one of the University officials
- No bags or cell phones or any digital devices permitted inside the venue LEAVE
  IT AT HOME OR OUTSIDE THE VENUE.
- If you bring water to the venue it must be in a **CLEAR bottle**, without any labels.
- Stationery must be carried in a **CLEAR A4 plastic bag/sleeve.** Students who bring pencil cases will have to empty them for inspection by the invigilators. **Candidates** may not use correcting pens, fluid or tape or any erasable pens in their answers for examinations.
- Please **BRING YOUR STUDENT CARD** or positive proof of **IDENTIFICATION**. This should be placed on the top right hand side corner of your desk.
- You may only write exams in those courses which appear on your current transcript, provided you have a valid DP in the course.
- All examination venues are under CCTV surveillance to ensure monitoring of examinations and should any examination infringement be detected, disciplinary actions in line with the student disciplinary code will follow.

Students are to adhere to the University COVID-19 health and safety protocol at all times. Non-adherence to the protocol is a disciplinary offence.

## **Online/Remote Examinations**

For Online and alternative assessments, individual departments will be responsible for the actual release of assessments on RUConnected and receipt/closure of the assessment. Kindly contact the respective department should you have any queries.
