SECOND FUNDING WINDOW OF THE 2019/2020 FINANCIAL YEAR: RESEARCH AND INNOVATION (DOCTORATE (PhD) AND MASTERS) BURSARY PROGRAMME

Food and Beverage Manufacturing Sector Education and Training Authority (FoodBev SETA) invites public universities to apply for PhD and Masters Students through the 2019/20 Research and Innovation Bursary Programme

Funding Opportunity

The FoodBev SETA has developed the Research Bursary Programme in response to the research and development needs of the food and beverages manufacturing sector. Research and development contributes to the body of knowledge and adds on the sectoral research innovation capacity. In addition, the programme also contributes towards the skills needed (i.e. researchers) to produce research that is relevant and has a positive impact on the sector, at the same time assist the FoodBev SETA in advancing its research agenda. Therefore, students with approved research proposals and with research topics relevant and responsive to food and beverages manufacturing sector are encouraged to apply for this research grant.

Value of the bursary

The bursary value is set at a sufficiently attractive level to provide an incentive to students to pursue postgraduate studies. The value of the awards will initially be set as follows:

- ✓ Master's students are eligible to receive a maximum of R120,000.00 (i.e. for the duration of the study) based on the evaluation outcome of the proof of registration
- ✓ PhD students are eligible to receive a maximum of R150,000.00 (i.e. for the duration of the study) based on the evaluation outcome of the students' approved proposals.

ELIGIBILITY

- ✓ Must be a South African citizen
- ✓ Students from previously disadvantaged groups
- ✓ Students with disabilities

FUNDING

FoodBev SETA will fund as follow:

Masters Students

- Students must be registered as full-time students at the university where their supervisor is based
- Students are required to submit proof of registration at their university
- ✓ Students will be required to submit the results

PhD Students

 Students who have an approved Research Proposal by the university

The SETA will fund the registration fees from the firstyear post research proposal approval by the university and subsequent years thereafter. The SETA will also fund costs associated with the research undertaken by Students ✓ The student must submit the Progress Report from their supervisors at the end of the academic year.
