

## SORGHUM TRUST BURSARY SCHEME

Students are invited to apply for bursaries to further their studies.

The most important conditions of bursaries granted by the Sorghum Trust are as follows:

- Students must be South African citizens and studying fulltime.
- Bursaries are only considered for Masters and Doctoral studies.
- The field of study must be relevant to the South African sorghum industry.
- The topic for the thesis has to be approved by the Sorghum Trust.
- The Trust requires a curriculum vitae, full past study particulars, a short summary of the intended thesis and a copy of the ID of every applicant.
- A mentor for the study programme has to be nominated and will be considered by the Trust, together with the university where the student intends to enrol.
- Students will be expected to work in the South African agricultural industry for a period equal to the period for which a bursary was received.
- The total bursary amount is R83 034 per year for two years for MSc studies and R100 506 per year for three years for PhD studies.
- The closing date for bursary application submissions is 31 January of every year.
- The Trustees have sole discretion as far as the award of bursaries are concerned and will consider each applicant within their own discretionary criteria.
