Executive Summary

Background

The African Water Resource Mobility Network (AWaRMN) is a programme of the Intra-Africa Academic Mobility Scheme which aims to promote cooperation between higher education institutions (HEIs) and support mobility in Africa. The overall objective of the scheme was to enhance human capital development in Africa, while strengthening intra-African cooperation in higher education as called for by Agenda 2063. AWaRMN was established with the aim to address the most pertinent water-related needs on the African continent.

The objectives of AWaRMN are:

- to increase the number of highly qualified and competent (MSc and PhD) graduates in the field of water resources in Africa
- to build and sustain teaching and research capabilities among partner institutions
- to design and implement research programmes based on collaboration and cooperation
- to facilitate student and staff mobility to promote multiculturalism and internationalisation among African HEIs
- to contribute to innovation and water technologies that advance social-economic development in Africa
- to enhance professional career development and employability of graduates

This report presents a summary of the impact the programme has had from its inception to date as an assessment of the extent to which the programme has met its objectives. The report is subdivided into three sections 1) Impact on partner institutions 2) Impact on scholarship holders 3) Impact on communities followed by conclusions. The impact report is to be revised and updated annually.

<u>Impact on partner institutions</u>

The AWaRMN programme has had a total of 7 staff (academic and administrative) travel between the partner institutions on mobility in 2023 and had selected 8 staff to go on mobility in 2024 as indicated in Table 1. At the end of 2023 the programme recorded a total of 16 MSc students on mobility and 11 PhD candidates across the partner institutions. A summary of selection results for 2023-2024 is provided in Table 2.

The summary shows that there has been a fairly even spread of mobility across all the partner institutions with fewer participants at ENSH University. ENSH University is a predominantly French speaking institution and most applicants to the programme have been English speaking. This is the first year in the programme in which staff have gone on mobility, proving positive progress on the programme's impact over time.
