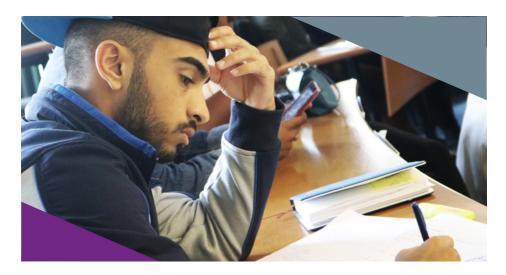

The PGDip EM PT is a one-year part-time programme offered by the esteemed Rhodes Business School, running from January to December. This qualification is an NQF Level 8 equivalent, worth 120 credits.

- Develop business development skills within your organisation.
- Cultivate an Intrapreneurial approach to business.
- · Enhance general management ability.
- Deepen and update your business knowledge, understanding, and practice.

- Problem-Based Learning: You will learn by doing, simultaneously acquiring conceptual understanding and practical skills. Assignments are typically work-based, encouraging application of learning within your own working context.
- Personal and Professional Growth: The qualification fosters in-depth, discipline-specific skills and applied competence, enabling personal intellectual growth, more purposeful employment, and a greater contribution to society. It empowers learners to solve problems, manage resources effectively, communicate effectively, and contribute to knowledge and socio-economic transformation responsibly, ethically, and innovatively.

Programme Structure & Content

The PGDip EM PT includes seven core subjects (Papers) and a value-adding Alpha Project. The seven Papers are worth 84 credits, and the Alpha Project is worth 36 credits, totalling 120 credits.

Core Modules (Papers):

- Strategic Marketing (SM): Focuses on integrating marketing plans into overall business strategies and developing case study-based marketing plans.
- Sustainable Economics (SE): Explores theoretical and applied economics concepts for managers in a sustainable economy, incorporating Resource-Based Theory and Bourdieu's Theory on Capital. It addresses externalities and reconciling economic growth with social justice.
- MBA Aligned Leadership for Sustainability (LfS): Considers the impact of corporate governance and social/environmental accountability on organisations and how to leverage these for competitive advantage.
- MBA Aligned Strategic Operations Management (SOM): Examines the interaction between strategy and operations from an agile perspective, applying Resource Based Theory and sustainable methodologies to improve quality, operations, and supply chains.
- Financial Management (FM): Covers aspects specific to entrepreneurs and intrapreneurs, including alternative capital sources, bootstrapping, financial contracting, insurance, private equity, taxation, business valuation, and key decision-making tools.

- People Management (PM): Focuses on managing organisational behaviour, leadership, human resource functions, and compliance with the South African labour relations framework, from the perspective of an SME manager.
- Business Development and Consulting (BDC): Investigates the role of business consultants, consulting frameworks, knowledge management, and effective, ethical communication in developing new business opportunities.

Alpha Project (AP):

This is a group business simulation project where you will report and present on your process and results.

Teaching & Learning Approach

The PGDip EM PT adopts a hybrid teaching and learning approach, combining various delivery methods to suit your busy schedule:

- On-Campus Teaching Blocks: Two one-week blocks (Saturday to Saturday 8am to 6pm daily) at Rhodes University.
- Virtual Online Teaching Blocks: Three six-week blocks, with six evening sessions (6pm-9pm) on Tuesdays and some Thursdays.
- Simulation Sessions: Eight virtual sessions spread throughout the year, taking place on Tuesday evenings sessions (6pm-9pm).
- Self-Paced Asynchronous Learning: Includes an academic skills component at the beginning of the programme and the Alpha Project spread through the year.

May 25 - Jun 30: Virtual online teaching block (BDC)

Jul 14 - Aug 25: Simulation sessions (FM, AP)

Sep I - Oct 6: Virtual online teaching block (SOM)

Oct 13 - Nov 24: Simulation sessions (FM, AP)

Eligibility & Requirements

Applicants must have obtained a degree in any faculty from a recognised university or institution, or an equivalent NQF level 7 qualification.

Technical Requirements:

- Competence in electronic office suite programmes (MS Word, Excel, PowerPoint, web browser).
- Your own laptop is essential for on-campus sessions.
- Access to reliable internet is necessary for online sessions.
- A suitable device with a webcam and microphone is required for online meetings (e.g., Zoom, MS Teams, Google Meet).
