1. Introduction

The world is facing rapid and fundamental transformations that have a dramatic impact on organizations and present leadership with new challenges. The challenge to leaders is to fundamentally change the way they think about, perceive, understand and act on the world in order to respond to a changing reality. This has brought on an unprecedented surge of interest in business leadership.

There are many definitions of leadership and many theories and models. This module is about the changing world and its impact on business organizations and in particular about understanding the leadership necessary for now and into the future.

5. Learning and teaching approach

Methods: Lectures, presentations, syndicate sessions, class discussion and arguments (debates), participant presentations

A "deep" approach to learning is followed whereby the focus is on thinking/analyzing as opposed to the accumulation/memorizing and repetition of information. Learners are seen to be active participants in their own learning, responsible for constructing their own knowledge. The teacher's role is to facilitate this construction process.

Participants must bring their own device for reading course content (e.g. Laptop or Tablet) as all resources are provided electronically on a Flash Drive.
