This list is an inventory of material in the Cory Library, arranged alphabetically according to the signatories of manuscripts and printed items, or under catchwords, and according to the subjects of illustrative material such as pictures and maps. Books, pamphlets, periodicals and newspapers are not included in this list.

The Cory Library has recently acquired a number of photographic copies of manuscript material and rare printed items by purchase and by gift, and these have been listed according to the form of the original documents. Thus MS 6419 is the microfilm of the Journal of Thomas Stubbs, owned by Mr. A. Calvin Evens of Cathcart, MS 6511 is the microfilm of the reminiscences of Edward Ensor, owned by Mr. B.H. Walton, of Auckland, New Zealand, and MS 6516 a microfilm copy of documents in the London Missionary Society Archives in London.

MSS 6517 to 6555, chiefly letters by Thomas Pringle, are photostat prints of documents in the National Library of Scotland; these have been acquired by the library through the courtesy of Mr. J.S. Pringle, of the Port Elizabeth Museum, and some have appeared in print in the Quarterly Bulletin of the South African Public Library.

MS 6476, A Narrative of the War of 1851-53, by I. Staples, is an undated typescript copy, presumably made from an original manuscript which is no longer in existence; it has been placed in the Cory Library on behalf of Miss Staples, the writer's daughter, of the Rest Haven Nursing Home, Devereux Avenue, East London, by the Rev. Arthur Edmunds, who has also issued roneoed copies of it for sale in aid of church funds.

MSS 6416 to 6418, and PR 392 to 502, were presented by Mrs. Crouch, on behalf of Mrs. Henchman. MS 6420 was given by Miss E.K. Heathcote, MSS 6423 and 6431 were given by Miss May Bell, through whose courtesy the copies of documents, MSS 6424 to 6430 and 6432 to 6436 were made. Mrs. Gates, who owns the originals of MSS 6437 - 6439, lent these to the library for copying.

MS 6442 was given by Mrs. V.S. Forbes, MS 6441 by Miss Margaret Kannemeyer, with PR 405 to 409, and MSS 6513 and 6514 by Mr. R.D. Caw.

MS 6443 was given by Mr. R. Gibson, MS 6446 by Mr. R.C. Mortimer, and MS 6447 and 6448 by The South African National Society, on behalf of the Grahamstown Nature Reserve Society.

MS 6444 and MS 6445, copies of manuscripts owned by Mr. L.L.F. Wood, of Willowvale, were made in the Cory Library through the courtesy of the owner.

The Late Mr. Theodore Mackenzie presented MSS 6452 to 6474, PR 410 to PR 416, and PIC 356.

MS 6475 was presented by Miss Una Long, and the collection of documents relating to John Paterson, first M.L.A. for Port Elizabeth, and Charles Cowen, MSS 6477 to 6510, PR 419 to 441, and PIC 361 by Mrs. H.C. McDonald.

PR 403 was given by Rev. H.C. Hopkins, PR 404 by Mr. J.C. Crisp.

PIC 349 was given by Miss June Hobson. PIC 350 by Mr. Donald McIntyre, PIC 351 to 354 by Miss Una Long, PIC 357 to 360 by Rev. H.C. Hopkins, and PIC 363 to 365 by Mr. B.H. Walton.

The only maps which have been added to the collection are MP 146 to 148, from Captain G.F.E. Anderson of Port Elizabeth, and MP 149, presented by Mr. M. Elton-Mills.

A notable addition to the library during the period covered by this list is the journal of Joseph Stirk, ( 2 bound volumes, MS, approx. 320 pp., 14 $\frac{1}{2}$  x 4".) recording general farming activities in the Peddie district from 1 November, 1848, to 31st Dec, 1854. As Mr. A.C. Jolly, the owner of this document has placed it on a permanent loan basis, it is not given an accession number in the usual way, but it is available for use by readers at the Cory Library. The Journal is described in "An Index to Authors of unofficial, privately-owned MSS..." by Una Long, p. 251.
