INTRODUCTION

This list of accessions covers all microfilms, pictures, and printed matter (other than books, pamphlets, periodicals, or newspapers) received by the Cory Library for Historical Research during the years 1953 - 1955. Manuscript material received during these years appears in Accession List No. 11, issued in 1956, and additions to the map collection are included in the Map Catalogue, 1957.

Accession lists previously issued cover the period October, 1945 to December, 1952; copies of all but the first three are still available.

Entries are listed under either signatories or subjects, in alphabetical order. The abbreviations 8vo., 4to., and fcp. are used somewhat loosely to give a rough indication of size. In the case of pictures and newspaper cuttings, measurements are given to the nearest half inch. In addition to the usual bibliographic abbreviations, the Library uses TS for a typewritten copy, and PR for a printed document.
