INTRODUCTION

This list of accessions represents manuscripts, microfilms, pictures, and printed matter received in the Cory Library for Historical Research during the years 1956-1957; maps received during the same period were included in the Map Catalogue, 1957.

Twelve lists of accessions have previously been issued, covering the period October, 1945 to February, 1956. Copies of all but the first three are still available.

Entries are listed under either signatory or subject, in alphabetical order. The abbreviations 8vo., 4to., and fcp. are used somewhat loosely, to give an approximate indication of size; in the case of pictures and newspaper cuttings, the measurements are given to the nearest half inch. In addition to the usual bibliographic abbreviations, the Library uses "TS" for typewritten copy, and "PR" for printed documents.

Notable items in this list include:-
