

# PAYMENT OPTIONS

#### **SOUTH AFRICAN STUDENTS**

# Option 1

An Initial Fee Payment of 10% of the annual tuition fee, and where applicable, 25% of the annual residence fees, is required by **19 January 2024 for returning students and 26 January 2024 for first time entering students**; Carefully note the payment due dates if you wish to be accommodated in residence.

# The Initial Fee Payment:

Tuition only: R6 500.00

Or

Tuition and Residence: R6 500.00 + R21 522.00 = R28 022.00

The balance of fees to be paid as set out below.

# Option 2

A 5% discount may be **claimed in writing** if the full annual tuition fee, and if applicable, full annual residence fee is paid **on or before 19 January 2024 for returning students and on or before 26 January 2024 for first time entering students**. The discount cannot be applied to tuition or residence fee separately as it applies to full fees.

# Option 3

Payment of the <u>full fees</u> by debit order with 11 monthly instalments from 1 February to 1 December. The debit order application form can be obtainable from <u>debitorders@ru.ac.za</u> or on the Rhodes website <u>www.ru.ac.za/studentfeesandfinancialaid/</u>. The form must be completed and signed by the person whose bank account is to be debited. All relevant documentation must be submitted by **12 January 2024.** Incomplete applications will not be considered.

A penalty of R247.00 will be charged on all unpaid debit orders. Three consecutive unpaid debit orders will result in the automatic cancellation of the debit order facility.

#### **NSFAS FUNDED STUDENTS**

NSFAS funded students are <u>not</u> required to pay an Initial Fee. Registration clearance is granted based on a funding list provided from NSFAS. NSFAS does not pay for additional charges not related to Tuition, Accommodation and Books. The fee-payer will be liable for other costs incurred.

Additional charges to be paid monthly per student fee statements.

# **INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**

# Option 1

Returning and first time entering international students will be required to pay 50% of their tuition and residence fees for the year by **19 January 2024 for returning students and 26 January 2024 for first time entering students.** The balance of fees is due by 31 May 2024.

Carefully note the payment due dates if you wish to be accommodated in residence.

Additional charges to be paid on receipt of student fee statements.

## **International Students Initial Fee Payment:**

Tuition only R 31 400.00

or

Tuition and Residence R 76 577.00

#### Option 2

A 5% discount may be **claimed in writing** if the full annual tuition fee, and if applicable, full annual residence fee is paid **on or before 19 January 2024 for returning students and on or before 26 January 2024 for first time <b>entering students**. The discount cannot be applied to tuition or residence fee separately as it applies to full fees.

# **IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL STUDENTS**

Electronic Fund Transfers (EFT's) can take up to 3 days to reflect on the student account. Fee-payers need to take this into consideration to adhere to the fee payment deadlines.

Registration will not be permitted if none of the options below have been taken up.

The Initial Fee is required upfront and cannot be paid by payment arrangement unless you opt for the debit order facility.

# 3. **BURSARIES/FEE REMISSIONS & CONCESSIONS**

**3.1)** Holders of recognised bursaries and scholarships including Rhodes University scholarships and merit awards may offset their award against the Initial Fee Payment required for registration. The award letter must be emailed to studentfees@ru.ac.za. If the bursary total amount paid exceeds the fees payable, the student may draw the balance on condition that the Bursar has given written permission. Please note that it is the responsibility of the student to ensure that bursary donors make payments timeously and in accordance with the University regulations. Students who hold full bursaries are reminded that they will require funds on arrival at the University for the purchasing of books etc., as it is not University policy to make loans or advances against bursaries prior to the funds being received.

# 3.2) Fee remissions, concessions, and special arrangements (full-time students only)

An application may be made for a second child remission should a parent have more than one child attending the University in the same academic year, as full-time students. The remission is equal to 30% of the tuition fee for any child after the first.

## 3.3) Academic Merit Award Scheme (SA students only)

Special merit awards are automatically made by the University to eligible students enrolling for the first time for an undergraduate degree. The awards, ranging from R29 940.00 to full tuition fee, are based on the final National Senior Certificate examination results. Should the student withdraw from Rhodes University during the academic year, the merit award will be reduced on a pro rata basis. To qualify for one of these awards a student would have to obtain at least 47 admission points in the National Senior Certificate examination.

International Students are not eligible for merit awards.

# 3.4) External Loans

Please note it is the responsibility of students negotiating loans with financial or other institutions to ensure that all payments are made to the University by the dates specified above.

The Initial Fee Payment may **NOT** be reduced by virtue of a student having negotiated a loan with a financial or other institution.

Monies once paid into a student account will not be refunded unless all fees have been paid and a credit balance is reflected on the account irrespective of any bursaries held or meal refunds due to the student. This is usually processed at the end of the academic year or when student withdraws from the University.

# 3.5) Penalties for non-payment of fees

The University will not release results, academic transcripts, and degree parchments if any fees are in arrears.

# 3.6) Refunds

Account refunds or payments to students will be made via Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT). Credit balance refunds will only be made upon receipt of written application from the person/organisation responsible for paying the account, supported by confirmation of banking details into which the funds are to be deposited. This is usually processed at the end of the academic year or when student withdraws from the University. A small credit may be retained to cover any additional second semester charges.

# 4. NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL/DEREGISTRATION (INCLUDING RESIDENCE)

- Students who wish to withdraw or suspend their studies must give notice, in writing, to the Registrar. (registrar@ru.ac.za)
- Any student who has registered for a course of study and who, for any reason leaves during the year is liable for a pro-rata fee up to the date of cancellation for tuition and/or residence fees. The basis of the calculation will include an academic year of 248 days.
- Any student who withdraws their application for tuition or residence before registration will be liable for cancellation fee of 10% if less than one month's notice is given or 2.5% if longer.
- In the case of an early withdrawal from Residence, for any reason, other than immediate family bereavement, medical illness or academic exclusion, a cancellation fee of two months Residence Fee will be levied over and above the fee calculation for the period of residence accommodation. A penalty will not be charged if a provisional residence booking is cancelled prior to the Initial Fee (IF) deadline of 19 January 2024 for returning students and 26 January 2024 for first time entering students.

# • In terms of Section 17 of the Consumer Protection Act (CPA) it states.

- A service provider may charge a reasonable fee for cancellation.
- Regard must be had to the nature of the service, the length of notice to cancellation, the reasonable potential to find an alternative consumer (in our case this would be a student) and the general practice of the University sector.

#### 5. OTHER FEE CONSIDERATIONS

# 5.1) Block fees (Tuition fees)

The regulations of the various faculties prescribe the number of courses full-time students are normally expected to take in each year of their curriculum.

Unless otherwise stated, the annual block fees include tuition fees for classes and laboratories, fees for ordinary University examinations and library fees for the normal number of courses. Full-time students taking fewer than the normal number of courses in any given year will still be liable for the full block fee.

# 5.2) Oppidan fee (for clarity please refer <a href="http://www.ru.ac.za/oppidan/faq/">http://www.ru.ac.za/oppidan/faq/</a>)

All full-time registered students, living off-campus will be charged a compulsory oppidan fee of R402.00.

Meals for Oppidans (Students who live off-campus)

The Meal options available are breakfast, lunch and supper on weekdays and weekends. The costs vary:

Breakfast R20.84 Lunch/Supper R56.07 (each)

### 5.3) Additional courses

Subject to the regulations of the various Faculties, **undergraduate** students may take in any year one course more than the normal number prescribed for that year of their curriculum without extra charge. **Full-time postgraduate** students may take in any year one undergraduate course free of charge, if they have obtained prior approval of their Head of Department and of the Dean of the Faculty and provided that a postgraduate student in Law may take first year courses in any one language subject in any year without extra charge. The undergraduate course becomes payable separately once deregistered from the full-time course.

# 5.4) Single course fees

Students doing one course towards their degree must be registered as full-time but will be charged the single course fee.

# 5.5) Departmental and additional charges

These are for course materials, handouts, field trips, printing vouchers, etc. and are additional charges to the student fee account. These charges vary as they depend on the courses taken and options chosen in each year of study.

# 5.6) Clubs and Societies

These refer to subscriptions for clubs and societies to be charged to student accounts.

# 5.7) Examination fees

Must be paid at the start of each semester for ordinary examinations written by students returning to write on extended DP certificates.

Students who fail to provide acceptable identification at examinations will be fined R363.00 per exam session.

# 5.8) IT Shop

IT consumables such as USB flash sticks and external hard drives etc are available from the IT Shop. Please see https://www.ru.ac.za/informationtechnology/itshop/ for pricing and more information.

# 5.9) Off Campus Network

## **Additional information**

- Residence fees differ because some residences have better facilities and/or are desirably located.
- Students' accommodation is based on single rooms. Adjustments are made in fees where students change residences. All residence fees are levied at the full rate for a single room in the appropriate residence at the beginning of the year. Where, for University convenience, students are permitted to share accommodation a 25% discount of the lodging will be applied. For discounts and adjustments, the residence year is taken as 248 days (PG Residences 340 days). A student does not have the right to claim an allowance for sharing a room where single accommodation in the residence is available.
- No charge is made for linen supplied or for laundry services. Students must provide their own toiletries and towels.
- No deduction is made from residence fees if a student is away from residence because of illness, or for any other reason, other than where the prescribed course of study required such absence. (Certificates to this effect must be obtained from the relevant academic Head of Department and submitted to the Residential Operations Division).
- Un-booked meals will be refunded to students' fee accounts at the end of each semester. Refunds will be limited to a maximum of <u>R3 383.03</u> per semester for those in undergraduate residences and <u>R4 638.03</u> per semester for those in postgraduate residences.

#### Meals for residence students:

Breakfast R15.92 Lunch/Supper R37.51 (each)

- Accommodation for students in undergraduate residences is available for a specific fee during the April
  vacation periods. No vacation accommodation is offered during the mid-year recess or the
  December/January period.
- Students who have withdrawn from residence <u>must</u> vacate their rooms within 24 hours of having given such notification to the University.
- Applications for residence fee remissions must be made to the Director: Residential Operations. Residence
  fee remissions will only be considered in cases of family emergencies (e.g.: Immediate family bereavement,
  illness of student, etc.).
