Noble started feeling unwell at the beggining of June when he complained of chest pain and discomfort. On June 1st his condition worsened and with the help of Betty he was admitted to Case Hospital on the 8th of June straight to the emergency room.

He was diagonised with high blood pressure, a CT scan showed features in line with severe covid pneumonia and treatment started on the numerous ailments.

Between 8th and 19th June, Noble could not sleep, which complecated the treatment. We had near death scares on the 19th and 22nd June when he suffered respiratory arrests and he was moved to a ventilator. However on the 30th of June the X-ray revealed a much improved condition. We were hopeful for recovery once again. Suddenly on the same day, oxygen levels dropped from 85% to 0%.

Dr. Judith and all collegues made efforts to get the oxygen up but we lost him at about 5:30pm on the 1st of June 2021.
