SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Submissions should be written in clear, jargon-free English with proper citation. Our goal is to be accessible to a variety of readers: International Relations scholars, Political Scientists, policy-makers, journalists, and others.

- Text format should generally follow Chicago Manual of Style.
- Submissions should be approximately 1,000 to 5,000 words.
- Submissions will be reviewed by the editors. Upon acceptance, submissions will be returned to authors for revision and resubmission.
- Endnotes in Chicago note style should be used.
- An abstract should be included, not to exceed 250 words.
