How can parents help learners to develop key foundations for learning? Prof Graven May 2013

SA Numeracy Chair at Rhodes university – Research & Development Gr 3 & 4 focus – numeracy foundations – often not developed ANAs TIMMS confirms Key research problems pointed to:

- Overdependence concrete counting (1 to 1) (e.g. 3 + 97)
- Must be supported by basic number sense bonds to 10, 20, + 10; 100 –
- seeing patterns is critical!
- Wonderful story of young Gauss German 1777 1 + 2 + ... + 98 + 99 + 100

But additionally our research point to overly teacher dependent dispositions. No teacher no learning – if I don't know I first ask before I think – don't try – ask – also fear of making mistakes but mistakes = learning if figure out where mistakes come from not if given answer

What do you do if you don't know an answer: majority – ask teacher – appropriate only if after trying

This is what as parents we must help our learners to develop – more independent dispositions

Anecdote Nosi – repeatedly says 'I din't understand' only because answer is not immediately evident

Researchers point to 3 key learning dispositions: resilience, playfulness, reciprocity So for helping kids with homework:

- When they don't know don't tell them what to do ask them questions so they figure out how to solve
- When they get an answer or some wrong ask how did you get that self correction is critical – check your work

Prof John Mason – thinking mathematically "Resist the temptation to make maths easy, keep it challenging and help the learners to love getting there – links to Nosi – major excitement when she worked it out. Similarly why Sudoku and challenging crosswords are so popular – not because they are simple

Remember Homework is about consolidation, routing and independence – extend them if too easy

Some fun ways to consolidate basics:

- Pop fizz (10; 20) vary
- Cards
- Dice keep in bag (double red 1 from Green & 12 sided dice)
- Cell phones and tablets (pop maths and more)
- Grocotts support also on our website these emphasis how parents help to point to patterns
- Hundreds chart to see pattern but then must put away.
