




Five children getting wet under the small umbrella.

Busi moans: There are too many children under this small umbrella


There are no children under the **big** umbrella.




Busi moans: There are still <u>more</u> children under this small umbrella and <u>less</u> under the **big** umbrella.



Busi moans: There are still <u>more</u> children under this small umbrella and <u>less</u> under the **big** umbrella.




Busi says: Now there are <u>less</u> children under this small umbrella and <u>more</u> under the **big** umbrella.




Is Busi right? What do you think will happen next?

Busi moves to the **big** umbrella.


No children getting wet under the small umbrella.

Ask children to find the

- numerals 0 to 5,
- number words zero to five,
- comparative words more, less,
 biq and small.

Tips for using this book:

- Talk about what might happen next, before you turn over each page.
- Draw attention to the key words and numerals on each page.
- Talk about the combinations of numbers (5 &0; 4&1; 3&2) that together make 5.
- After the story, talk about what happened in the story.
- Ask children to re-tell the story.
- Ask children to pretend read the story.
