
Tips for using this book:


Gogo says:


We need to build a fire.


I need ten sticks.

Thabo likes green sticks.








Here are four fires

Which fire did Gogo make?






Busi says:

This block has questions to think about and to talk about.






Gogo says:

Let's make the fire.






You have one stick.

You have one,


but I have four.

then he had six.


He gave her one more,

How many sticks did Gogo want for the fire? Can Gogo build her fire now? Explain.




Busi says:

How many more sticks must they get to have ten sticks altogether?







I take your sticks.

Please give me my sticks back!






You have five sticks.

Do they need more sticks? Explain.






Oh no!

How many sticks will Thabo have if he picks up the two sticks?






But I can run with five sticks on my head.
